Code A says: An officer must not search a person if there is no specific power to do so. This applies even if the person would consent to being searched. The only exception to this is search on entry to premises where consent to being searched is a condition of entry.

Substantive Law on Stop and Search The placing of a general stop and search on a statutory footing was only achieved by s.1 of the Police and Criminal Evidence Act 1984 (PACE).
